

Glossary

Beach – A sandy or pebbly shore by the sea or a lake.

Big – Of considerable size, extent, or intensity.

Book – A set of written, printed, or blank pages bound together.

Brave – Showing courage and facing fears or danger without hesitation.

Bright – Giving off or reflecting much light; vivid in color.

Castle – A large, fortified building often associated with royalty or fairy tales.

Cat – A small domesticated carnivorous mammal, often kept as a pet.

Change – To make something different from its original state.

Chest – A large, strong box, often used for storing valuables or treasures.

Climb – To go up something, like stairs or a mountain, using effort.

Couch – A comfortable piece of furniture for sitting or lying down.

Crown – A decorative headpiece worn by royalty.

Dig – To break up or remove earth, often with a tool, to uncover something.

Dream – Thoughts, images, or aspirations; also, the act of imagining while asleep.

€ Electric – Powered by electricity or relating to it.

End – The final part of something, like a story.

Explore – To travel through an unfamiliar area to learn about it.

Fairy Tale – A fictional story featuring magical and fantastical elements.

Favorite – Something or someone preferred over others.

Fire – The phenomenon of combustion manifested in light, heat, and flame.

Fly – To move through the air, like birds or airplanes.

Forest – A large area covered chiefly with trees and undergrowth.

Friend – A person who shares a bond of mutual affection and support.

Fun – Something that provides amusement or enjoyment.

Funny – Causing laughter or amusement.

Glasses – Lenses in frames worn to correct vision or as protection.

Gold – A precious yellow metallic element used for coins, jewelry, etc.

Green – A color like that of grass or emeralds.

Happy – Feeling or showing pleasure or contentment.

Hat – A shaped covering for the head, often worn for style or protection.

Hero – A person admired for bravery, achievements, or noble qualities.

Home – The place where one lives, often associated with comfort and safety.

Jewel – A precious stone used in jewelry.

Jungle – A dense forest, often in a tropical area.

Kind – Having a caring, considerate, and gentle nature.

Knight – A person granted an honorary title of knighthood, often seen in medieval stories.

Lion – A large, powerful wild cat with a mane, often called the "king of the jungle."

Magic – Supernatural powers or the art of creating illusions.

Map – A visual representation of an area, often used for navigation.

Pirate – A person who attacks and robs ships at sea.

Place – A particular position, area, or location.

Pokémon – Fictional creatures from the Pokémon franchise, often trained and battled.

Princess – The daughter of a king or queen or a prominent female character in a story.

Quiet – Making little or no noise.

Read – To look at and comprehend written text.

Red – A color at the end of the visible spectrum, often associated with passion or danger.

Roar – A loud, deep sound made by a lion or a similar animal.

Save – To rescue or protect something or someone.

Shoes – Footwear to protect and comfort the feet.

Shiny – Reflecting light or glowing brightly.

Short – Having a small height or length.

Silly - Lacking seriousness; playful or foolish.

Smile – A facial expression showing happiness, often with the corners of the mouth turned up.

Soft – Having a smooth, gentle texture.

Sparkle – To shine brightly with flashes of light.

- Story A narrative of events, real or imaginary.
 Strong Having great physical power or showing strength of character.
 - **Sword** A weapon with a long, sharp blade and a handle.
- Tall Having a greater height than average.
 Treasure Valuable items, often hidden or sought after in stories.
- Unicorn A mythical horse-like creature with a single horn on its forehead.
- Wings Appendages used for flying, often found on birds, insects, or mythical creatures.
